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About this Directory

This directory is an offshoot of the *Directory of African American Infant Mortality Efforts in Hennepin and Ramsey Counties*, a handout created for the Black Birth Summit (BBS) held on September 17, 2019 sponsored by the Minnesota Department of Health's Center for Health Equity (CHE) and Community Voices and Solutions (CVAS). Starting with Summit registrants and later, additions by Summit attendees who reviewed it, the original directory contains the names and contact information of individuals and groups in Hennepin and Ramsey counties whose work touch on African American infant mortality. It is meant to serve as a starting point for them to connect with one another so they can marshal their collective strengths and resources to implement sustainable change. Out of that directory arose the need to produce a separate directory that exclusively lists black birth workers. This *Directory of Black Birth Workers in Hennepin and Ramsey Counties* has the names and contact information of direct service providers who are either of African descent or work largely with people of African descent in these counties. The content is crowd-sourced, therefore it is a living document. The intended user is any woman or a family member looking for culturally competent perinatal care (preconception, pregnancy, birthing, or post-partum care) or other birthing resources.
