

# Governance and Organizational Structures in Minnesota's Community Health Boards

# Governance Structures (January 2025)

Minnesota Statutes identify two governing structure options for counties and cities to legally organize themselves to do the work of public health: community health boards (under Minn. Stat. § 145A) or human services boards (under Minn. Stat. § 402). Multi-county community health boards (or CHBs) are formed through joint powers agreements, which allow them to work across geo-political boundaries. Currently, there are 52 CHBs in Minnesota. MDH also partners with Minnesota's eleven American Indian tribes to provide public health services.

## Single-County, City, or County/City CHBs (25 CHBs: 21 counties, 4 cities)

County board assumes the duties of the CHB OR appoints a CHB. Organized under Minn. Stat. § 145A.

# **Organizational Structures**

Organizational structure is a term used to describe the way in which a local health department is organized within a city or county. Unlike governing structures, which are dictated by statute, organizational structures are locally determined. Public health can be a stand-alone department or organized with other departments or divisions, such as human services. Public health can also be a department or division within a hospital or health care organization.
