Parties may move the court to use an alternative location or remote option on a case-by-case basis.

Public Comment Hearings

- Presumed location: Webex
- Virtual attendance increases public participation
 - One virtual contested case received 76 comments overall compared to 2 the prior year
- Parties may move the court to use an alternative location, including:
 - > In person
 - Teams
 - Hybrid


Face masks strongly recommended

- Face masks may be temporarily removed while testifying or speaking in court

eComments allows the public to




eComments Feedback

- Unprofessional
- Difficult to find and navigate
- Designed like social media
- Does not combine all important information in one place
- Does not create a report of all comments in the order received

- Provides central location
- Allows for a range of formality
- Promotes transparency by publishing comments in real time



- Cursive font is hard to read


Our plan
