(Approximate tick sizes)






Adult female, adult male, nymph, larva



Prevent tickborne diseases

- Check for ticks at least once a day.
 Use an EPA-registered repellent (e.g., DEET or permethrin).
- Call your doctor if you get a fever, rash, or other symptoms after being in or near wooded or brushy areas.

Tick removal dos and don'ts



DO pull up gently and slowly.

DO clean the bite area.



X DO NOT burn with a match.

X DO NOT cover with petroleum jelly.

X DO NOT pour kerosene on the tick.
