Prevent tickborne diseases

- Check for ticks at least once a day.
- Use an EPA-registered repellent (e.g., DEET or permethrin).
- Call your doctor if you get a fever, rash, or other symptoms after being in or near wooded or brushy areas.

Tick removal dos and don'ts

- ✓ DO remove as quickly as possible.
- ✓ DO use tweezers or fingers to grab the head as close to the skin X DO NOT cover with as possible
- ✓ DO pull up gently and slowly.
- ✓ DO clean the bite area.

X DO NOT burn with a match.



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
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
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
