

# Child Care Immunization Report: Vaccine Doses Guide

## Minimum Immunization Requirements for Child Care in Minnesota

- Use this chart and the reporting worksheets to help complete the Child Care Immunization Report.
- Find the child’s age, and see if the child had the number of shots shown by the check marks under each vaccine.
- Rotavirus and flu vaccines are not required but are highly recommended for all infants and young children.

① If the child has already had chickenpox disease, varicella vaccine is not required. The child’s doctor must sign a form.

② Child must have one dose by age 24 months when enrolled in child care. New enrollees 24 months or older must have one dose at time of enrollment.

**Exemptions** To enroll in child care in Minnesota, children must show they’ve had these immunizations or file a legal exemption.

Parents may file a medical exemption signed by a health care provider or a non-medical exemption signed by a parent/guardian and notarized.
